



At the heart of our vision is the desire to build bridges and build family. This resource is intended to be a tool that would help facilitate you, the spiritual leader of your family, to grow and develop your children in the fear and admonition of the Lord. While not exhaustive, our prayer is that it would give you a place to start in effort to better steward your role as mom or dad.

What follows is a four-day devotional that loosely follows our Sunday sermon series. It includes a passage to read, a prompt or two to discuss together, and a prayer to offer in response to your time. These efforts are simply offered as helpful direction. Feel the freedom to adjust, shift, or redirect the focus as best fits the few moments you take with your kids before bedtime, after dinner, or whenever you choose to lead them in God's Word.

Day 1

Passage: Read Hebrews 10:1-4

Younger Prompt: What was the law a shadow of? What was it impossible for the blood of bulls and goats to do?

Older Prompt: How were we made perfect so that we can now draw near to God?

Pray: Lord Jesus, thank you for being our perfect sacrifice before God, allowing us access that we now may draw near to Him because of your perfect blood given for us.

Day 2

Passage: Read Hebrews 10:5-10

Younger Prompt: What does this passage say God does NOT want, ultimately? What does the Lord actually desire? (vs. 7)

Older Prompt: What was the Lord's will for His Son (vs. 7, 9-10)? How are we, as His children, to do the same thing?

Pray: Lord, thank you that Jesus was obedient to your will. Show us what you desire for our lives, and help us to walk faithfully in it as well.

Day 3

Passage: Read Hebrews 10:11-14

Younger Prompt: How frequently did the priests offer sacrifices? How frequently did Jesus offer sacrifices? Which one was the most effective?

Older Prompt: Why was it necessary for the priests to offer sacrifices repeatedly, yet Jesus' was given once, and for all time?

Pray: Lord, thank you for your Son's blood shed on the cross for our sins. Thank you that through His blood we can have life abundant.

Day 4

Passage: Hebrews 10:15-18

Younger Prompt: Does God remember our sins? What is no longer necessary for our sin when God grants us forgiveness?

Older Prompt: Why is an offering for sin no longer necessary? How ought this cause us to want to live?

Pray: Lord, thank you for making us clean forever. Thank you for bearing the consequence of our sin once and for all. Help us to walk in obedience with you, seeking your will, out of a grateful heart.
