



At the heart of our vision is the desire to build bridges and build family. This resource is intended to be a tool that would help facilitate you, the spiritual leader of your family, to grow and develop your children in the fear and admonition of the Lord. While not exhaustive, our prayer is that it would give you a place to start in effort to better steward your role as mom or dad.

What follows is a four-day devotional that loosely follows our Sunday sermon series. It includes a passage to read, a prompt or two to discuss together, and a prayer to offer in response to your time. These efforts are simply offered as helpful direction. Feel the freedom to adjust, shift, or redirect the focus as best fits the few moments you take with your kids before bedtime, after dinner, or whenever you choose to lead them in God's Word.

Day 1

Passage: Read Hebrews 1:1-4

Younger Prompt: What does this passage say about who Jesus is? What are all the different ways He is described?

Older Prompt: What does the way the author describes Jesus say about who He is in comparison to the angels, and why does it matter?

Pray: Lord thank you for showing us that your Son is greater than the angels. Help us to honor Him as King and worship Him alone.

Day 2

Passage: Read Hebrews 2:1

Younger Prompt: According to this passage, what are we to pay closer attention to? If we don't, what does the verse say will happen?

Older Prompt: What are some ways your attention can drift when you aren't giving proper attention to Jesus?

Pray: Lord, help us to pay attention to you. Show us where we are prone to drift, and keep us from losing sight of you. May we stay anchored to you and not something less stable.

Day 3

Passage: Read Hebrews 2:2-4

Younger Prompt: Was the message of the Old Testament reliable? If the message wasn't followed, was it met with a consequence? Is the message of Jesus even more wonderful than that of the Old Testament?

Older Prompt: Why should we not neglect our great salvation?

Pray: Lord, thank you for giving us the salvation message. Thank you that salvation is found in you alone. Help us to give you our attention and devotion as we seek you first in our lives.

Day 4

Passage: Hebrews 2:1-4

Younger Prompt: Why must we pay closer attention to the that which we have heard? What are we to avoid?

Older Prompt: What tempts you to drift from God the most? What ways can you be proactive and pursue Him so that you do not drift?

Pray: Lord, thank you that we cannot lose our salvation. Thank you for making a way for us. Give us a focus on you and not the things of the world. Help us to grow closer to you each day and resist the temptation to drift any other direction.
